Somehow, Christmas wouldn't be the same without bells. Look through the cards and decorations and spot the bells. Ding Dong Merrily on High is one of our favourite Christmas carols, but look at the words and you will scarcely find a direct reference to Christmas! The carol sounds Christmassy because of the bells and the lovely tune.

The pandemic has restricted ringing of the church bells in the confines of the tower ringing chamber, but we still hope to make a joyful noise from the tower for Christmas. Of course, ringing handbells outdoors is less restrictive. We will ring carols in Shrivenham High Street on the Saturday before Christmas as we have done for many years and our charity collection boxes in aid of the Children's Society will be to the fore too. We really hope that we can ring handbells in the Carol Services too, but we have recorded a few just in case! The handbells we shall be using were cast by different founders over three centuries. They include one by Robert Wells of Aldbourne from the early 1700s and some by Mears of Whitechapel from the mid-1900s among others. The majority were cast by James Shaw of Bradford in the late 1800s. Brought together and restored in the late 1970s, I hope you will agree they make a beautiful blend.
